

Best Rome Site Seeing

If you are one of the lucky to go on a Rome vacation, then be prepared to see and visit many historic locations during your Rome trip. With a history that goes back to more than two and a half thousand years, Rome site seeing trips are bound to fill you with awe at the magnificence of this Italian city.

Vatican City

One of the important Rome places to see is the Vatican City. The Vatican Museums in Viale Vaticano display numerous treasures collected over many a century by the Roman Catholic Church. Since their inauguration in the 16th century by Pope Julius II, the halls decorated by Raphael in both the Sistine Chapel and Stanze della Segnatura have had been visited by millions on a yearly basis.

Another place tours of Rome hardly exclude is St. Peter's Basilica. Chosen by St. Peter, who was one of the twelve apostles of Jesus, the land which now has the Basilica constructed on it is considered to be one of the holiest places in the world. With St. Peter buried there and the Pope residing at it, this is one of the places many Christian pilgrims head to when searching faith and peace.

Colosseo: The Roman Colosseum

Located within the heart of Rome, the remains of the largest amphitheater of Ancient Rome still exist. Previously, this structure used to seat 50,000 Romans as they watched gladiatorial games, executions, dramas and much more. Today, tours of Rome are incomplete without a visit to the interior arena and new Eros museum in this magnificent structure.

Pantheon

After the Colosseum, the Pantheon is one of the must-see places when traveling on a Rome Vacation. Originally built as a temple for all the gods of Ancient Rome, the Pantheon was rebuilt in the 2nd century A.D. The beauty of this place lies in the building's oculus, which is located in the dome's apex and is the only source of light in the building. Rome site seeing groups are usually lead into the burial chamber where Raphael and King Vittorio Emanuele I are buried along other famous Italians.

Fontana di Trevi : The Trevi Fountain

One of the most scenic Rome places to see is this fountain in the Trevi rione, With 85 feet in height and 65 feet in width, this is the largest Baorque fountain in the city. Designed by Nicola Salvi in the second half of the 18th century, the statues carved into the fountain represent Neptune and Tritons on both of his sides. If you want to experience another Rome trip soon, throw a coin over your left shoulder into the fountain.
